Hand Bell Choir Practice Thurs 5:30pm Five years ago, Michael Brown was shot and killed by a Ferguson policeman. The ensuing week was marred by riots and an over the top display of police power by St. Louis County. In an instant the work that people who lived in Ferguson, working together as neighbors and friends was shattered. The economic costs were immense, but the damage and mistrust among community members was even more significant. The gentle balance that held together Ferguson was torn apart and five years later, it still remains tentative.

A lot has changed in Ferguson, the city council is more representative of the city's community members. Religious bodies reached across denominational and racial lines seeking ways to help heal the brokenness it experienced every Sunday in its pews. Yet there was fall out as well, as long time residents left Ferguson. Property values fell and Ferguson became a term for all that was wrong in America.

I remember these things five years later not to open up old wounds but to remind us that our work as a church is perhaps even more important today than it was five years ago. We have embarked on a journey to remake ourselves into a place where all are welcomed and represented in all areas of leadership. We have developed new partners in ministry in order to provide support and care for our neighbors. We are attempting to revise how we understand our role in the larger community by realizing without a healthy community, we cannot have a healthy church.

It is my hope and prayer that Ferguson will fulfill its duty as a city and that it will become a place where all people are represented fairly and equally. That it will celebrate the diversity of its citizens and continue its journey toward healing and reconciliation. That, we in this church, may have a place in that healing and reconciliation by investing in the community in ways that are honest and life giving. May we learn from our past, be present in new ways today and invest in a future where this church sees itself and the community building a future together.


