One hundred fifty years ago, 9 people, stepped out in faith and planted the seeds for a new community of faith to emerge and here we are. Much has changed during that 150 years, which has challenged this church to respond to the Gospel in new ways that were aligned with the values that we have in our spiritual DNA today.

The journey wasn't always easy, nor was it without controversy, yet Ferguson Presbyterian resisted being defined by its troubles and sought out the Spirit of Truth and Forgiveness, overcoming its "demons", in order to fulfill its commitment to the Gospel. There will be similar challenges before us, but I am confident that the old Spiritual: "I Want Jesus to Walk with Me" will be our prayer. "I want Jesus to walk with me. (and just to be sure they meant it, they sang it again) I want Jesus to walk with me, all along my pilgrim journey. Lord, I want Jesus to walk with me!" You are a group of people that I am proud to sing this song with.





















#### **Worship Schedule**

Per capita is an opportunity for all members of the Presbyterian church to participate equally, responsibly and interdependently by sharing the cost of co-ordination and evaluation of mission and of performing ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions that identify a Reformed Church, while at the same time strengthening the sense of community among all Presbyterians.

Each member is asked to share in paying their Per Capita apportionment, \$32.00 (same amount as last year) per member in 2021. This breaks down to \$20.15 for Presbytery, \$2.90 for Synod and \$8.95 for GA.

You may pay your Per Capita by clearly earmarking your payment of cash or check for 'Per Capita' and mailing it to the church. Thank you for supporting the benefits of being a connectional church.




#### REFLECTING ON THE THEME
