## A BIT OF FIRST PRESBYTERIAN HISTORY

Have you ever looked at this photo and wondered where the original First Pres was located? I always assumed it was at Elizabeth and Church Streets but Kathy Noelker of the Ferguson Landmarks Commission set me straight! It was actually located at Clay and Church, next to where the Kennedy's house would later be built. Coming off Elizabeth, Church Street ended in a cul de sac behind the church and the street was not opened up until 1952, probably for Fire Trucks after the "new" City Hall and Fire Station were built. The Atwood family, who lived at 118 South Clay (later owned by the Hallorans and seen on the Hoarders TV show) donated the land for First Pres and then again for the present-day church built in 1927 after the original church burned.

When Kerry and Oona were in St. Louis in April, Monica and Jan met with Kerry after church to discuss Outreach at FPC. Our history of offerings and how funds have been used in the past was reviewed and then we shared what was on our hearts. Kerry noted that we were pointing to listening to what our community wants and needs instead of providing what we think our community wants and needs. It was a great meeting and between Kerry and Mike we are in the process of discerning how we can find out what is needed in Ferguson and beyond and how we can connect to the myriad of resources available in St. Louis. For example, if job interviewing or job training are needed in our community, what are the resources that are available that we can facilitate to connect the person to the best training. The need is great, but the possibilities and resources are there!

Monica and Jan would like to invite you to LISTEN with us! We recommend three things:

- 1. Read the book: The Moment of Life by Melinda Gates
- 2. Listen to Dr. Art McCoy's interview on DonneyBrook Next Up <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?">https://www.youtube.com/watch?</a> <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?">v=dcV32GSB0KI</a> McCoy's interview starts about 30 minutes into the YouTube recording. McCoy is retiring from serving as the Superintendent in the Jennings School District and will begin a new role as the Workforce Development Leader for the Regional Business Council.
- 3. Pray for LISTENING and guidance to where we might best serve our brothers and sisters.

Both Mike and Kerry are in action around how we can LISTEN in the community and how we can put ourselves in the midst of the need and then connect the need to the training. If you know of a resource in St. Louis that supports people through special training like job interviews or career counseling, or financial planning, or parenting lessons, or absolutely any supportive training ... please send an email or call Monica and Jan. We are LISTENING to who you are connected to because our strength is in working together as a community. We all benefit when someone feels empowered and loved and worthwhile.

It is a default to "decide" what we think is needed and we are moving in the direction of "listening" to what is needed. God and our brothers and sisters will guide our hands and feet to provide the love and resources to fill the need. We are excited about the direction and the path that is ahead of us.

# **BUILDING USE REMINDERS**
