FROM THE PASTOR

Summer has roared in with a fury with temperatures over 102, accompanied by vintage St. Louis humidity. Then, just as suddenly it slipped away for a bit, but wait, it will return and makes us yearn for cooler days. Reflecting on these unusual temperature shifts draws my attention to the shifting most churches have had to do. Our first instinct in facing these shifts in church life will push us into a direction of trying to recreate a calmer, more amenable time. It is my sense that we must resist such impulses and avoid quick fix responses to a topsy-turvy world that has always been lurking right below the surfaces of the calmer days.

If the last year or so of dealing with COVID-19 has left behind any wisdom, it lies in the understanding that 1) being alive is a challenge; 2) that may mean letting go of valued ways of doing things; 3) that uncomfortable work lies ahead, and 4) that we have to be flexible in our responses to the needs before us. Easier said than done, but I am confident this church, led by Pastor Kerry, and I, are up for the challenge. Not because we have all the answers, but because we are surrounding by God's love and a community that is able to shape us and mold us into the people we are called to be. The work before us is not easy work, but it is the work of new life that makes a real difference in our community, in our church, and in our very being. So, join us and let us see where God is taking us.

On behalf of Pastor Kerry and myself, we want to invite you, your friends and everyone you know to join us in our Co-Installation, July 25 at 2pm. The party awaits you so be ready for what is the first leap of First Church into its new reality. PS: Seatbelts and Helmets are highly recommended because this will be one interesting journey.

We welcome the Rev. Dr. Kerry Allison as co-pastor of the Ferguson Presbyterian Church on July 25, 2021. Dr. Allison will be sharing leadership with the Rev. Mike Trautman until he retires in February 2022 after serving the congregation for 21 years. At that time Dr. Allison will become the Pastor. Dr. Allison has been pastor of the Church of the Redeemer, PCUSA in Los Angeles for 12 years. His 30 years of ministry experience includes:


